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

How to get to the venue

By Underground: Tower Hill – 1 min walk (District, Circle and Docklands Light Rail Services). On leaving Tower Hill tube station by walking straight out of the exit, turn right and walk for 100 meters past the Grange City Hotel and under the overhead train line bridge where you should turn right into Crosswall. The entrance to America Square Conference Centre is 50 metres on your right through the revolving doors.
